Life cycle	The changes a living thing will go through.
Reproduce	To produce young.
Gestation	The process or time when prenatal development takes place before birth.
Adolescence	The social and emotional stage between childhood and adulthood.
Adulthood	The stage of development when a human is fully grown and mature.
Life expectancy	The length of time, on average, that a particular animal is expected to live.
Puberty	When adolescents become capable of reproduction.
Hygiene	Actions to keep ourselves and our bodies clean.

Sticky Knowledge

When babies are young, they grow rapidly. They are very dependent on their parents. As they develop, they learn many skills. At puberty, a child's body changes and develops primary and secondary sexual characteristics. This enables the adult to reproduce.


This unit is linked with PSHE and normally with a visit from the school nurse.
