Write sentences that...  
establish a viewpoint and are elaborated with supportive arguments  
showcase my individual style  
maintain 'a role' in a believable way  
introduce ideas in a clear, engaging way  
conclude and summarise clearly and restate my opinion  
use humour for effect  
parody a well known author/text

Write sentences that...  
• create imagery situations  
• use figurative language  
• create imaginary characters using specific detail to engage the reader  
• use metaphors to impact the reader  
• use pathetic fallacy to heighten character's emotions

Write consistently in paragraphs to show...  
• change in place  
• change in time  
• change in event  
• change in person  
• shifts in character 'high'/'low' perspective in narrative

Complex sentence that includes...  
• embedded relative clauses using full range e.g. *who, which, where, when, whose, that* - *Maisie, who was extremely tired, finished the race*  
• embedded 'ing' clauses e.g. *Maisie, running with all her energy, finished the race*  
• 'ed' starting word clause e.g. *Petrified that she wouldn't finish, Maisie pelted to the finish line.*

Make links with paragraphs through...  
• sentences that link two concepts together  
• opening linking with conclusion  
• words/phrases/sentences that join ideas together  
• supportive evidence in non-fiction to justify a point  
• use a wide range of cohesive devices e.g. repetition of words, ellipsis, phrases and chains of references e.g. *Despite their heroic efforts...*

Write sentences that...  
• 'who' and 'did what' and 'result' format  
• use verbs deliberately and succinctly  
• use pronouns to avoid repetition of noun

Write sentences that use...  
• addition connectives e.g. *also, moreover, furthermore*  
• listing connectives e.g. *first of all, finally*  
• opposition connectives e.g. *in contrast, alternatively*  
• indicating results connectives e.g. *therefore, consequently*  
• reinforcing connectives e.g. *besides, anyway*  
• explaining connectives e.g. *for example*

Write sentences that include...  
• semi-colons  
• colons to introduce a list/explanation/definition  
• hyphens to avoid ambiguity



Use green ambitious vocabulary

Write sentences to include...  
• range of prepositional phrases  
• 'how' adverbial phrases  
• 'how often' adverbial phrases e.g. frequently  
• degree of intensity adverbial phrases e.g. fairly well, very slowly  
• verb phrases e.g. should have considered
